SUM IT UP

What? The Sum It Up strategy requires readers to select words

related to the main idea of a reading.

Why? The Sum It Up strategy focuses students' attention on

key words they can use to build a summary. It also requires critical thinking in making decisions about which words are necessary to demonstrate learning.

How? Select a brief passage for summary. Demonstrate the

processes of selecting key words or phrases that may be important in determining main idea. Show students how to narrow the selection after reading is completed. From the remaining list, create a summary statement of 20 words or less. Extra points may be awarded for

successful statements with fewer words.

When possible, encourage students to mark on the text

before writing on the organizer.

After modeling, students can practice this in groups,

pairs, and independently.
